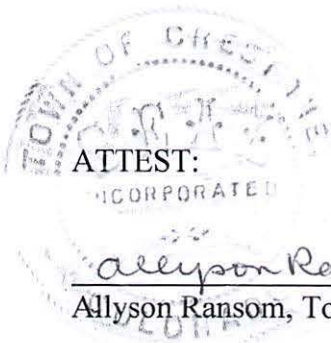
**DESIGNATION OF OFFICIAL STATUS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR
2021 FOR THE TOWN OF CRESTONE**

WHEREAS, it is the duty of the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Crestone, a Colorado Town, to make certain appointments and designations of official status for the calendar year 2021,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Crestone that:

1. Allyson Ransom is appointed as Town Clerk, Gwynn Busby is appointed as Town Treasurer, Eugene L. Farish, P.C. is appointed as Town Attorney, and Chris Friesell is appointed as Town Judge.
2. The official posting places for notice of meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be the locked bulletin board outside the door of the Town of Crestone Town Hall, 108 W. Galena Avenue, the bulletin board outside the meeting room at 111 S. Alder Street, and the bulletin board located inside the U.S. Post Office, 161 E. Silver Avenue. Postings shall be made at least twenty-four hours in advance of any public meeting.
3. The Town Board Meetings shall be held at the Town Hall Meeting Room at 111 S. Alder Avenue, on the second Monday of each month, at 9:30a.m., unless notice is otherwise provided.
4. The Crestone Eagle is hereby designated as the official and legal newspaper for the Town of Crestone with alternate newspapers being The Saguache Crescent and The Valley Courier.
5. The First Southwest Bank is designated as the depository for the Town funds.

Town of Crestone Public Street Closures Policy

1. No public streets, rights of way of alleys may be closed unless with prior board approval and completion of a road closure application by the requestor, such as for repairs, block parties, farmers' markets and other pre-approved events.
2. The Board of Trustees of the Town of Crestone, as directed, have full rights over street closures of town property, be they for repairs, utility purposes, dangerous road conditions, vandalism, public health and safety, or other reasons. The town may not permanently block access to any owner's property.
3. Whenever the condition of any town street, either newly or previously constructed, altered, repaired, or improved, or any part thereof, is such that for any reason its unrestricted use or continued use by vehicles or by any class of vehicles will greatly damage that town street, will be dangerous to traffic, or it is being constructed, altered, repaired, improved, or maintained in such a manner as to require that use of the town street, or any portion thereof, be closed or restricted to all vehicles or any class of vehicles for any period of time, the Board of Trustees as the governing body of the town is authorized to close the town street to travel by all vehicles, by any class of vehicles, or may declare a lower maximum speed for any class of vehicles, for such a definite period as it shall determine.
4. Nothing in the law of this state prevents the Board of Trustees from classifying vehicles according to gross weight, axle weight, height, width, length, braking area, performance, vehicle combinations, or tire equipment for the purposes of this section, or from restricting the use of any portion of any Town of Crestone street, alley, or right of way to its use by a town public transportation system.
