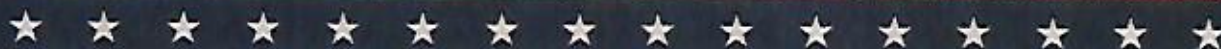

After three successful years, we have established a proven program and are now inviting local ranchers, businesses, and community members to help us expand this effort.

While the Roy Williams Foundation offers many programs that support Veterans and First Responders, the beef program has become one of our most appreciated. It provides not only nourishment during difficult times, but also a tangible reminder that our community recognizes and values their service and sacrifice.



Another meaningful program of the Roy Williams Foundation is the beautiful American Flag display that lines U.S. Highway 285 between Poncha Springs and Nathrop. The display commemorates the funeral procession that carried Roy's remains to his memorial service. On that day, members of the community gathered in large numbers along the highway, holding American flags to honor Roy and the many Veterans and First Responders who have lost their battles with PTSD.
